Late last year, we hired Master Michell Ge as the Performance Director for our province. Most of you know her as an accomplished Kyorugi, Poomse competitor, and coach. We look forward to her contributions and will have a report from her later this meeting. Now, our Federation finally has two paid contractor staff members. Master Michell Ge and Master Steve Large, and I feel very lucky to have them both.

Speaking of High Performance, many of you know that I am now the World Taekwondo Technical Committee Chair. I just returned from Grand Prix in Rome and GP Challenge in Muju and want to give some feedback about the new rules.

On behalf of World Taekwondo, under the leadership of Dr. Choue, it is my mission as the Chair of the Technical Commission to make our sport more dynamic for spectators and the media and to improve fair play further. We use the Best of the 3-round system to produce a more dynamic & exciting game.

We see fluidity in the match by combining the new rules and the Best of 3 round system. Previously, we have experienced 10-15 Kalyeo in a game to break the flow consistently, equivalent to about 30 seconds or more delay.

Now, the players are the ones that control the flow of the match instead of frequent interruptions from the Referee. We want to end improper techniques like the Monkey Kick (even to the head), which started from the introduction of PSS. It is time to eliminate the animal kicks and inspire more powerful kicks from a distance. We also limit two lifts in the air to minimize foot fencing and encourage more dynamic techniques using both legs.

Feedback was positive, and we will move forward.

As always, I want to thank our Vise President Master Tony Kook and Secretary-General and Treasure Master Minku Chang, Board of Directors, volunteers, committees, and all of you as the Taekwondo Masters and leaders. As a team and organization, I look forward to another year ahead and providing leadership to make it a success for everyone. Thank you.

3. RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Large, aesthetic venues: As our numbers grow, we outgrow spaces like Capilano University & BCIT. Venues such as the Richmond Oval, Langley Events Centre, and Vancouver Convention Centre give us the space we need and make our events grand and desirable. Especially to competitors thinking of coming from out of Province.

2. Podium & Banners: A student fell off the podium at the last tournament due to its lightweight. We also didn't use any banners because they are damaged and wrinkly. I suggest we invest in new banners (no date!), roll-up banner cases, and podiums.

3. Switch back to Medals: Instead of trophies, we opt for higher-quality medals and avoid adding the date to the medal. Instead, we include the date and federation logo on the custom lanyard attached to the medal. Leftover lanyards are not nearly as costly as leftover medals & trophies. We can reuse the medals the following year and order new lanyards instead.

4. Participation Ribbon or certificate > Participation Medals + Compete for Bronze: These recommendations aim to increase the integrity of the competition and make earning a medal more coveted.

5. Increase the quantity and quality of referees: firstly, thank you to Master Kim for doing an outstanding job; I know Covid made recruiting & training refs extremely challenging. If our Tournaments are to grow, we must invest more resources into recruiting, training, and equipment.

- 6. Increase tournament revenue through:
- A. Action Shot Prints (Instagram page)
- B. Photo Booth
- C. B.C. TKD Merchandise (hoodies, t-shirts, hats)

Thank you to the Board of Directors for appointing me to this position. I look forward to your feedback on my recommendations and will work hard to implement whatever changes the Board sees fit. 1. Referee Development:

Virtual referee seminars have been conducted by WT and TKD Canada this year, especially leading up to Kyorugi Nationals in Toronto where the new WT rules were implemented with good success.

2. Membership:

Unfortunately, during the pandemic, the number of registered and active BC referees fell by about 70%. We currently have 43 active BC referees (the lowest in nearly 10 years), with another 25 outof-province referees who have expressed a commitment to attending BC tournaments to assist when needed.

3. Referee Seminars:

Provincial referee certification seminars resumed on February 6, 2022, with 27 people signed up and 25 attending the seminar in Port Moody, including 18 new referees. A virtual refresher seminar was held on March 26, and an in-person refresher seminar has held on April 8, prior to the BC Championships. A virtual refresher is being planned for July to review the new WT kyorugi rules.

4. Tournament Participation:

1) Korean Consul General Cup (October 16, 2021): only 16 referees participated, but included 6 International Referees (3 from out-of-province from Utah, AB, ON)

2) Canadian Nationals, Poomsae (February 26-27, 2022, Virutal): attended by 2 BC IRs

3) Canadian Nationals, Kyorugi (April 15-17, 2022, Toronto): attended by 3 BC IRs

4) BC Championships (April 9, 2022): 24 referees, including 4 out-of-province refs (from AB, SK, MB, PEI)

5. Equipment:

Two additional KPNP e-helmets were purchased for the BC Championships, as well as 3 laptops to replace aging equipment, and 6 Android tablets for official poomsae judging.

6. Goals for 2022-2023:

1) resume kyorugi referee seminars (in-person and virtually) for the new sparring rules

- 2) have more Provincial referees progress to P2 and P1
- 3) to start implementing a more formal process for certifying Provincial poomsae judges
